




Futura is a geometric sans-serif typeface designed by Paul Renner and released in 1927. It was designed as a contribution on the New Frankfurt project. It is based on geometric shapes, specially the circle, similar in spirit to the Bauhaus design style of the period.

Garamond, 1480-1561, was a French publisher and type designer whose designs are the basis for many modern Garamond versions. Others are based on designs of Jean Jannon, a French printer who was also inspired by Garamond's work.
